Cat Information**You, your Cat and the Law**

Cat Identification

The City of Stirling recognises two different methods of cat identification: A collar, with the owners name and either their address or phone number on it; or A micro chip embedded beneath the cat's skin holding the same information.

**Cats in Prohibited Areas**

Cats are prohibited within certain areas of the City. These areas are designated by the City of Stirling to protect local flora and fauna. If your cat is found in a prohibited area you may incur a fine.

The following are Cat Prohibited Areas:

- Star Swamp
- Carine Open Space
- Gwelup Open Space
- Trigg Bushland
- Herdsman Lake
- Jackadder Lake
- Dianella Regional Open Space
- Hamersley Golf Course
- Cottonwood Crescent Bushlands
- Mirrabooka Open Space
- Beach Reserves

A Fauna Protection Buffer Zone is an area extending 200 metres from the boundary of a Cat Prohibited Area.

Cat Permits

Permits are required if you have three or more cats in the City of Stirling. However, if you are within a Fauna Protection Buffer Zone, you may only keep one cat without a permit. If you have four cats you will need to apply for a cattery (\$45). These rules do not apply to cats under the age of three months.

****IMPORTANT** Please note that HOUSEHOLD permits for up to 3 cats are now \$18 and \$9 (for pensioners).**
